He began his artistic training with undergraduate studies at New England School of Art in Boston, MA. continued his education on a graduate level at Massachusetts College of Art, with a concentration in watercolor. He studied with well respected artists such as Joseph Santoro, Charles Demotropolis and Tom O'Hara. His studies also included work with watercolorist Claude Croney A.W.S. and Don Stone A.W.S.

Ralph is a Copley Master in the Copley Society of Boston, a member of the New England Watercolor Society, The Rockport Art Association and The Whiskey Painters of America (WPA). His watercolor painting of 'The Old State House in Boston,' was selected from among 3,000 entries, as one of the 100 winners in the First Annual "Arts for the Parks" competition. The paintings were on exhibition in the Great Hall of the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D.C. Mr. Bush was the recipient of Yankee Magazine's prestigious Robb Sagendorph Memorial Award for Art, presented by the Copley Society of Boston.

He enjoys annual visits to Maine's Monhegan Island where he takes great pleasure in the tranquil environment and inspiring scenery for his paintings.
